



## **YOUNG PROFESSIONAL AWARD**

### **Sponsored by Lindsay Oxlad**

#### **Aim of Award**

This award aims to recognise young transport professionals in Australia and New Zealand who have contributed to the advancement of the transport profession early in their career.

#### **Eligibility**

To be eligible for this award, nominees must be professionals working in transport who are no more than 30 years of age.

#### **Criteria**

The criterion used to judge nominations is:

- Significance of their contribution to the advancement of the transport/traffic engineering profession, relative to their experience in their chosen field.

Significant contributions may include the following attributes in relation to the nominee's level of experience:

- outstanding technical ability which has contributed significantly to improved project or program outcomes
- shown innovative thinking which has resulted in projects or programs taking a different direction and achieving successful outcomes
- made significant contributions - formally or informally - to their profession or to the professional development of their colleagues
- demonstrated superior professional ethics when faced with difficult decisions or when tackling adverse positions
- the ability to bring people together in a way which creates synergies and added value
- demonstrated superior organisational or business development abilities.

#### **Nominations**

Candidates may nominate themselves or may be nominated by a senior work colleague. Self-nominees must provide at least one referee, ideally a person of long-standing industry experience.

The submission should include:

- a brief (150-1000 words) rationale setting out the basis of the nomination
- any other contacts or referees who could provide more information
- contact details.

Nominations for the award will be judged and determined by a sub-committee made up of ITE-ANZ executive board members and other transport professionals.

Nominators and candidates should note that the sub-committee may make enquiries regarding the candidate's standing within the areas of expertise and experience which form the basis of the nomination.

## **Award**

The award will be announced at the ITE-ANZ Annual President's Dinner in Melbourne in November.

The recipient will be granted:

- an engraved plaque
- free membership of ITE for one year (reimbursement of fees)
- cheque for \$1000, kindly donated by Lindsay Oxlad Consultants
- travel costs to attend the award ceremony if from interstate or New Zealand.
